Meeting Minutes

Commissioners present at the meeting were: Reno, Campbell, Decker (via telephone), O'Connell, Ryan, Smith, Glenn

Mr. O'Connell called the meeting to order and asked for everyone to review the minutes. Ms. Smith made a motion to approve the minutes from the October 2015 meeting. The motion was seconded by Mr. Glenn and subsequently approved by the Commissioners.

Mr. O'Connell opened the meeting to hear visitors' questions or comments. There were no comments or questions from visitors.

Mr. O'Connell mentioned that he had heard nothing from the Ohio Board of Commissions regarding the hiring of an Executive Director for the OFMJC. He told the other Commissioners that he would follow-up regarding the hiring process.

Dr. Barlow mentioned that Mr. Reno had been reappointed by the Senate. She also mentioned that she is still waiting on the reappointment of the House Commissioners (O'Connell, Ryan and Campbell) and a new appointment since Dr. Markovich resigned. She has been in touch with the Staff for the Speaker of the House. Ms. Brigner told the Commissioners that per legislation, their current appointment is valid until renewed, canceled or resigned.

The Commissioners then worked their way through the draft OFMJC Report with each Section lead, giving detailed comments. The Section leads will make final changes with the goal of the Commissioners reviewing the report at the next meeting on Dec 11, 2015. The Commissioners will sign the report at this meeting and the report will then be sent to the Governor, House and Senate leadership by the end of December 2015. The Commissioners will present the Strategy to the Governors Staff, and the leadership of the House and Senate in January. After comments from the State are received, the Commissioners plan to get the strategy to each region of the State.

Mr. O'Connell asked if there was any new business. Hearing no new business, he asked for a motion to adjourn. Ms. Ryan made a motion to adjourn and Mr. Reno seconded the motion with unanimous agreement by the Commissioners. The meeting was adjourned at 2:00pm.
