BIOGRAPHY

CSM Albert M. Whatmough

Command Sergeant Major Albert M. Whatmough enlisted in the Ohio Army National Guard in January 1986. He graduated from Akron St.Vincent-St.Mary High School, and completed his Army Basic Training at Ft. Knox, KY as an Armor Crewman. He was assigned to the 3rd Squadron, 107th Cavalry and has served in a variety of enlisted positions to include tank driver, loader, gunner and tank commander on the M48, M60, M1 and M1A1 series tank. Additional assignments include Instructor and Course Manager at the Ohio National Guard State Military Academy, 145th RTI. In 1991 he was re-assigned as a Platoon Sergeant to Company D, 1st Battalion 107th Armor where he was promoted to the rank of First Sergeant. Other assignments include 16th Engineer Brigade Operations Sergeant Major for Joint Task Force Chiriqui, Honduras. In 2000, he was selected and promoted to the rank of Command Sergeant Major of the 1st Battalion, 107th Armor which reorganized into the 145th Combined Arms Battalion (Heavy).



CSM Whatmough is a graduate of the Primary Leadership Development Course, Tank Commanders Course, U.S. Army Observer Controller Course, Basic and Advanced Noncommissioned Officer Academy, Battle Staff Course. In 2004, he graduated from the United States Army Sergeants Major Academy. CSM Whatmough is graduated from the University of Akron and holds a bachelor's degree in Management Information Systems and is enrolled in a Master's of Science Program at Central Michigan University.

During 2004-2005 he completed a combat tour supporting Operation Iraqi Freedom and served as the Command Sergeant Major for 6,800 soldiers, airmen and U.S. Army Contractors on Forward Operating Base Endurance in the Northern region of Iraq near the city of Mosul, Ninawa Province. January of 2007, CSM Whatmough was selected and assigned as the Command Sergeant Major of the 37th Infantry Brigade Combat Team, with an authorized strength of 3,680 soldiers and deployed on his second tour in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom. The 37th IBCT supported operations in Iraq, Kuwait and Afghanistan. In March of 2009 CSM Whatmough was selected to serve as the State Command Sergeant Major for Joint Forces Headquarters Ohio, with an end strength of 11, 611 Soldiers.
