Whatmough selected for senior enlisted position in the Ohio Army National Guard

COLUMBUS, Ohio – Command Sgt. Maj. Albert Whatmough has been chosen as the new senior enlisted Soldier for the Ohio Army National Guard. He is replacing Command Sgt. Maj. William Gilliam who is retiring after 30 years in the Ohio National Guard.

Prior to this selection, Whatmough was the 37th Infantry Brigade Combat Team (IBCT) Command Sgt. Maj. and recently returned from a year-long deployment to Southwest Asia. While deployed as the senior enlisted Soldier, his duties included planning, coordination, training, combat operations, combat intelligence, and Soldier welfare for 2,500 Soldiers.

“Command Sgt. Maj. Whatmough's extensive background and service at the battalion and brigade level make him a superb choice to serve as the senior enlisted advisor on our great Army team,” said Maj. Gen. Matthew L. Kambic, assistant adjutant general for Army. “MG (Gregory L.) Wayt, (Ohio's adjutant general) and I will rely on his judgment and advice, much the same as we did with Command Sgt. Maj. Gilliam.”
