**BATTERY A GUIDON**

This guidon was used by Battery A, 1st Battalion, Ohio Volunteer Artillery during the War with Spain. The swallowed tail guidon is made from a scarlet material with yellow crossed cannons in the center. Ohio is above the artillery insignia and the battery letter "A" is below. Battery A was organized in Cleveland on May 22, 1873 as the Cleveland Light Artillery.
