**OCTOBER 1916:** Soldiers from the 1st Engineer Battalion, Ohio National Guard march into camp at Las Cruces, N.M. during federal service along the Mexican Border.



## WEEK IN REVIEW

**M** **OCTOBER 10, 1877:** Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 237th Support Battalion (First Cleveland Troop) and Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 1st Battalion, 145th Armored Regiment (Black Horse Troop) are organized in Cleveland as the First Cleveland Troop, an independent volunteer militia company.

**OCTOBER 10, 1950:** The 112th Bomb Squadron, 112th Utility Flight, 112th Weather Station and 206th Air Service Group, Ohio Air National Guard, are ordered into active federal service for the Korean War.

**OCTOBER 15, 1940:** The 37th Infantry Division is inducted into federal service by order of the president and sent to Camp Shelby, Miss. for 12 months of training.

**Su** **OCTOBER 15, 1962:** The 178th Wing, 179th Airlift Wing and 180th Fighter Wing are allotted to the Ohio Air National Guard and receive federal recognition as the 178th, 179th and 180th Tactical Fighter Groups in Springfield, Mansfield and Toledo, respectively.



## HALL OF VALOR

**PRIVATE  
GEORGE BRENSTUHL**

**COMPANY L, 166TH INFANTRY,  
42D DIVISION**

**OCTOBER 15, 1918 - ST. GEORGES, FRANCE**

**CITATION:** The President of the United States of America, authorized by Act of Congress, July 9, 1918, takes pleasure in presenting the Distinguished Service Cross to Private George Brenstuhl, United States Army, for extraordinary heroism in action while serving with Company L, 166th Infantry Regiment, 42d Division, A.E.F., near St. Georges, France, 15 October 1918. Seeing the only other company runner killed while delivering a message of vital importance, Private Brenstuhl crawled from shell hole to shell hole during a rain of machine-gun bullets, took the message from the dead man, and completed the mission.
