**W** DECEMBER 7, 1920: Company A, 1st Battalion, 145th Armored Regiment is organized in Ravenna as Troop L, Cavalry.



PROMOTION CERTIFICATE

Francis B. Folk enlisted in Findlay's Company C, 148th Infantry in January 1933 and was promoted to the rank of corporal in his hometown unit in May of that year. This promotion certificate was signed by the regimental commander, Col. Gilson D. Light. Folk was commissioned a second lieutenant in 1940, and was awarded the Silver Star Medal during World War II. He was the first commander of the 73d Brigade, 38th Infantry Division in 1968 and retired as a colonel in 1970. In 1991, the Findlay armory was dedicated as the Col. Francis B. Folk Armory.
