APRIL 21, 1923: The coat of arms for the 148th Infantry Regiment is approved, marking the first Ohio National Guard unit to receive War Department approval.

APRIL 23, 1920: Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 837th **Engineer Battalion is organized** in Springfield as the 1st Separate Machine Gun Company.

APRIL 26, 1945: Baguio, the Philippine summer capital city, is captured by the 37th Infantry Division.

APRIL 27, 1927: The 285th Medical Company is organized in Columbus as Headquarters Company, 3d Battalion, 166th Infantry.





## "THE PASSING SHOW BY THE 4TH OHIO" **COLUMBUS SUNDAY DISPATCH CARTOON, APRIL 1919**

This cartoon appears in a April 1919 edition of the Columbus Sunday Dispatch marking the return of the 166th Infantry from France in April 1919. The 166th Infantry was formerly the 4th Infantry Regiment, Ohio National Guard and was based in Central Ohio. The cartoon depicts a ship returning to port with the Soldiers of the regiment on the deck of the ship. Waiting for the Soldiers on the dock are women with flowers. Each woman has a name of the various towns that were home to the regiment: Columbus, London, Cardington, Marion, Marysville, Circleville, Greenfield, Chillicothe, Delaware, Lancaster and Washington Court House. The 166th Infantry was the first Ohio unit to depart for France in 1917 and was the last to return to the United States in 1919. The unit was part of the 42d "Rainbow" Division, which was made up of National Guard units from numerous states.
