WEEK IN REVIEW

MAY 26, 1942: The 37th Infantry Division sails from San Francisco for Fiji and New Zealand.

MAY 27, 1864: Brig. Gen. Thomas Wood's 3d Division, IV Corps conducts the main assault against the Confederate right flank at the Battle of Pickett's Mill, Ga. Ohio regiments made up 10 of the 22 regiments in Wood's three brigades.

MAY 27, 1953: The emblem for the 121st Air Refueling Wing was approved for the 121st Fighter-Bomber Wing.

MAY 29, 1945: The 37th Infantry Division begins the Cagayan Valley Campaign on Luzon, Philippine Islands.

JUNE 1, 1944: The 122d Army Band is organized on Bougainville as the 37th Infantry Division Band.

JUNE 1, 1973: The 121st, 178th and 180th Security Forces Squadrons are federally recognized as the 121st, 178th and 180th Weapons System Security Flights.

CWO HENRY N. MONACO INSIGNIA 37TH INFANTRY DIVISION BAND

Henry N. Monaco (1922-1989) was the bandmaster for the 37th Infantry Division Band from 1958 to 1964. His insignia includes the 37th Infantry Division Shoulder Sleeve Insignia, warrant officer junior grade rank insignia and the warrant officer branch insignia. Monaco enlisted in the Ohio National Guard in 1938, serving in the 166th Infantry Band. After World War II, he reenlisted in the 37th Infantry Division Band and was a master sergeant when the 37th served in federal service during the Korean War. He was commissioned as a warrant officer in 1955 and retired in 1964.
