

- 1875** Organized 19 June 1875 in the Ohio National Guard at Youngstown as the “Iron Guards”¹²
- 1876** Redesignated 6 July 1876 as Company B, 10th Infantry¹³
- 1879** Redesignated 18 January 1879 as Company A, 10th Infantry¹⁴
- 1881** Redesignated 27 January 1881 as Company C, 8th Infantry ¹⁵
- 1887** Redesignated 11 May 1887 as Company H, 5th Infantry (Logan Rifles)¹⁶
- 1898** Mustered into Federal service 11 May 1898 at Camp Bushnell, Ohio as Company H, 5th Ohio Volunteer Infantry; mustered out of Federal service 5 November 1898 at Cleveland and reverted to state status as Company H, 5th Infantry¹⁷
- 1899** Redesignated 14 April 1899 as Company H, Unattached Infantry¹⁸
Redesignated 14 July 1899 as Company H, 5th Infantry¹⁹
- 1916** Mustered into Federal service 19 June 1916 at Camp Willis, Ohio; mustered out of Federal service 15 March 1917 at Fort Wayne, Michigan²⁰
- 1917** Redesignated 3 April 1917 as Company B, 10th Infantry²¹
Called into Federal service 15 July 1917²²
Drafted into Federal service 5 August 1917
Reorganized and redesignated 15 September 1917 as Company B, 135th Machine Gun Battalion, and assigned to the 37th Division²³
- 1919** Demobilized in April 1919 at Camp Sherman, Ohio

- 1921** Reorganized and Federally recognized 28 March 1921 in the Ohio National Guard at Youngstown as the 7th Separate Machine Gun Company²⁴
 Reorganized and redesignated 1 May 1921 as Company H, 3d Infantry²⁵
 Reorganized and redesignated 1 July 1921 as Company H, 145th Infantry, an element of the 37th Division²⁶
- 1940** Inducted into Federal service 15 October 1940 at Youngstown²⁷
- 1942** (37th Division redesignated 1 February 1942 as the 37th Infantry Division)²⁸
- 1945** Inactivated 13 December 1945 at Camp Anza, California²⁹
- 1947** Reorganized and Federally recognized 28 October 1947 in the Ohio Army National Guard at Youngstown as Company D, 145th Infantry³⁰
- 1952** Ordered into active Federal service 15 January 1952 at Youngstown³¹
- 1954** (Company D, 145th Infantry [NGUS] organized and Federally recognized 15 January 1954)³²
- 1954** Released 15 June 1954 from active Federal service and reverted to state control; Federal recognition concurrently withdrawn from Company D, 145th Infantry (NGUS)³³
- 1959** Reorganized and redesignated 1 September 1959 as Company D, 2d Battle Group, 145th Infantry and relieved from assignment to the 37th Infantry Division³⁴
- 1963** Converted and redesignated 1 April 1963 as Troop F, 2d Squadron, 107th Armored Cavalry Regiment³⁵
- 1968** Converted and redesignated 1 May 1968 as Company B, 437th Military Police Battalion³⁶

- 1972** Converted and redesignated 1 February 1972 as the 1484th Transportation Company³⁷
- 1974** Converted and redesignated 1 June 1974 as Troop K, 3d Squadron, 107th Armored Cavalry Regiment³⁸
- 1977** Converted and redesignated 1 May 1977 as Company C, 112th Engineer Battalion³⁹
- 1994** Reorganized and redesignated 1 December 1994 as Company D, 216th Engineer Battalion⁴⁰
- 1997** Reorganized and redesignated 1 September 1997 as Company C, 216th Engineer Battalion⁴¹
- 2003** Ordered into active Federal service 18 December 2003 at Youngstown; released from active Federal service 16 April 2005 and reverted to state control⁴²
- 2006** Location changed 1 January 2006 to Newton Falls⁴³
- 2007** Reorganized and redesignated 1 September 2007 as the 1192d Engineer Company⁴⁴
- 2009** Ordered into active Federal service 11 June 2009 at Newton Falls; released from active Federal service 15 July 2010⁴⁵
- 2017** Consolidated 1 September 2017 with the 290th Engineer Detachment (see ANNEX); consolidated unit designated as the 1192d Engineer Company⁴⁶


