

- Reorganized and redesignated 1 July 1921 as Company D, 147th Infantry, an element of the 37th Division¹³
- 1930** Redesignated 1 October 1930 as Company H, 147th Infantry¹⁴
- 1939** Redesignated 1 November 1939 as Company K, 147th Infantry¹⁵
- 1940** Inducted into Federal service 15 October 1940 at Springfield¹⁶
- 1942** (37th Division redesignated 1 February 1942 as the 37th Infantry Division)¹⁷
- 1943** Relieved 31 July 1943 from assignment to the 37th Infantry Division¹⁸
- 1945** Inactivated 23 December 1945 at Ft. Lewis, Washington¹⁹
- 1946** (147th Infantry assigned 10 June 1946 to the 37th Infantry Division)²⁰
- 1947** Reorganized and Federally recognized 17 February 1947 in the Ohio Army National Guard at Springfield as Company K, 147th Infantry²¹
- 1952** Ordered into active Federal service 15 January 1952 at Springfield²²

- 1954** (Company K, 147th Infantry [NGUS] organized and Federally recognized 5 March 1954 at Springfield) ²³
Released from Federal service 15 June 1954 and reverted to state control; Federal recognition concurrently withdrawn from Company K, 147th Infantry (NGUS)²⁴
- 1959** Consolidated 1 September 1959 with Service Battery, 136th Field Artillery Battalion (see ANNEX 1); consolidated unit designated as Company A, 137th Signal Battalion²⁵
- 1963** Reorganized and redesignated 1 April 1963 as Company B, 137th Signal Battalion²⁶
- 1964** Reorganized and redesignated 1 April 1964 as Company C, 137th Signal Battalion²⁷
- 1968** Converted, reorganized and redesignated 15 February 1968 as Company D, 216th Engineer Battalion and relieved from assignment to the 37th Infantry Division²⁸

- 1994** (237th Support Battalion assigned 1 September 1994 to the 38th Infantry Division)³⁴
- 2004** Ordered into active Federal service 5 July 2004 at Springfield; released from active Federal Service 1 November 2005 and reverted to state control³⁵
- 2007** Consolidated 1 September 2007 with Detachment 1, Company B, 237th Support Battalion (see ANNEX 4); consolidated unit designated as Headquarters and Headquarters Company, Special Troops Battalion, 37th Infantry Brigade Combat Team and relieved from assignment to the 38th Infantry Division³⁶
- 2008** Ordered into active Federal service 4 January 2008 at Springfield; released from active Federal service 9 January 2009 and reverted to state control³⁷
- 2011** Ordered into active Federal service 15 October 2011 at Springfield; released from active Federal service 17 November 2012 and reverted to state control³⁸

- 1942** Organized 1 February 1942 at Camp Shelby, Mississippi as Service Battery, 136th Field Artillery Battalion, an element of the 37th Infantry Division³⁹
- 1945** Inactivated 13 December 1945 at Camp Anza, California⁴⁰
- 1947** Reorganized and Federally recognized 22 September 1947 in the Ohio Army National Guard at Springfield⁴¹
- 1952** Ordered into active Federal service 15 January 1952 at Springfield⁴²
- 1954** (Service Battery, 136th Field Artillery Battalion [NGUS] organized and Federally recognized 15 January 1954)⁴³
