OHARNG Wins ACOE Competition

On April 24, Ohio Governor Ted Strickland applauded the Ohio Army National Guard for being selected as the 2009 Army Communities of Excellence Special Category Winner for the Fiscal Year 2009 by the Department of the U.S. Army.

The Army Communities of Excellence (ACOE) Award recognizes the Ohio Army National Guard's (OHARNG) effort in improving their overall performance and capabilities. The Fiscal Year 2009 award marks the third time Ohio has won the competition. The ACOE program uses the Malcolm Baldrige National Quality criteria, which provides a framework for in-depth organizational assessment and measurements for improvement. "When we began this process in 2002 we were seeking ways to improve as an organization," Wayt said. "The Baldrige criteria provided us the vehicle by which we can continually improve our processes." In addition to the award, the Ohio Army National Guard will receive \$750,000 for use toward improving the "quality of life" for the full-time employees and Soldiers of the OHARNG.

In 2002, the OHARNG submitted its initial ACOE self assessment and was named the "Rookie of the Year." Since 2002 the Ohio National Guard has been recognized as the NGB's overall winner in 2003, 2004 and 2006. In 2005, the organization was awarded First Place in the Gold Division as the NGB's entrant to compete in the Department of the Army competition.

Where does DFAS mail the \$10,000 check? If Defense Finance and Accounting Service officials all of a sudden decided they wanted to mail you a check for \$10,000 – no direct deposit allowed – would you receive it? Many retirees and annuitants would not because DFAS has a wrong address on file for them. Many of you assume that as long as DFAS has your correct direct-deposit information, there is no reason to keep DFAS informed of your whereabouts. Not true.

DFAS must have current mailing addresses so it can mail out important information and documents regarding your state/federal taxes, the Survivor Benefit Plan, a Retiree Account Statement, etc. And there is always the possibly for that big check! (A person can dream.) You can check your current address on file by calling (800) 321-1080, or accessing your MyPay account online. And while we're on the subject of DFAS, the best time to call for routine matters is NOT at the beginning of the month. More people call DFAS at the beginning of the month to report pay problems than any other time, so naturally the wait times will be much longer. If possible, wait until at least the middle of the month to call or use the online services at http://www.dfas.mil/.

Death of a spouse affects Survivor Benefit Plan coverage - Remember your retirement party 20 years ago? Do you remember out-processing? Do you remember the Survivor Benefit Plan briefing you received? If a retiree can answer "yes" to at least one of the questions, it is most likely the question about the party. Many retirees do not remember specifics about SBP coverage. Unfortunately, both the Air and Army Retiree Services Offices receive calls almost daily from retirees whose spouses have just passed away, and the SBP coverage needs to be suspended. Counselors advise retirees to send a certified

copy of their spouse's death certificate, along with a brief letter or completed DD Form 2656-6 (SBP Election Change Certificate), to the Defense Finance and Accounting Service. The mailing address is: DFAS, U.S. Military Retirement Pay, PO Box 7130 London, KY 40742-7130; or via fax to (800) 469-6559. Premiums are suspended effective the first day of the month following the month the spouse dies. SBP spouse coverage is not terminated when a spouse dies. Coverage is placed in a suspended status pending a possible future marriage. For more information: https://ca.dtic.mil/dfas/s-retired/ret-pay.htm

Gates Visits Camp for Surging Troops (Washington Times, May 8). A huge U.S. military camp is taking shape in the baking heat of southern Afghanistan for thousands of extra U.S. troops charged with defeating a resurgent Taliban. Defense Secretary Robert M. Gates visited Camp Leatherneck, with concrete blast walls and sand-colored tents, as he surveyed preparations for what will be the biggest wave yet in a year that is seeing U.S. troop numbers doubled. www.washingtontimes.com/

Pakistan Announces Army Offensive Against Taliban. (Washington Post, May 8). Pakistan's prime minister told the nation that the armed forces were being "called in to eliminate the militants and terrorists" who have forcibly occupied part of the country's northwest, sending thousands of civilians fleeing from the region in the past week. Prime Minister Yousuf Raza Gillani's announcement, made in a late-night, televised address, signaled the final collapse of a fragile peace accord between the government and Taliban forces in the Swat region. It also represented the civilian government's formal green light for a full-fledged offensive by the military, which until now has been fighting sporadically. www.washingtonpost.com/
